YEAR: 10 SUBJECT/PWNC: Art and Design

Knowledge Focus: Understanding and developing skills in the Elements of Art, with a focus on Line, Tone, Colour, and experimental techniques through the study of key artists.

Skills, knowledge and understanding to be developed in this Learning Plan: Students will explore the foundational elements of Art, focusing on line, tone, and colour through both drawing and painting. They will experiment with techniques inspired by artists such as Van Gogh, Matisse, and Jenny Gravette. They will develop skills in tonal studies, observational drawing, colour mixing, and experimental watercolour methods while understanding and applying colour theory.

Key terms to be learned in this LP:

Line, Tone, Form, Colour Theory, Continuous Line, Still Life, Acrylics, Tints, Shades, Tonal Studies, Watercolour Techniques, Artist Research.

- Introduce "drawing with scissors" inspired by Henri Matisse or Jenny Gravette.
- Develop research skills to study the selected artist's use of shape and colour.
- Create paper cut-out compositions inspired by the artist's work.
- Explore composition, shape balance, and positive/negative space.

Week/Wythnos 6 Learning Objectives:

- Explore experimental watercolour techniques (wet-on-wet, dry brush, salt, lifting, glazing).
- Create a series of watercolour samples to develop technical skills.
- Apply watercolour techniques to a still-life composition.
- Reflect on successes and challenges in watercolour experimentation and annotate work.

Week/Wythnos 7 Learning Objectives:

- Introduce Colour Theory: primary, secondary, tertiary, tints, tones, and shades.
- Explore acrylic painting techniques, including layering and blending.
- Develop skills in mixing colours to create a range of tints, tones, and shades.
- Create an acrylic painting that demonstrates form through colour mixing and layering.
- Refine painting skills to create a series of acrylic paintings, focusing on realism and 3-Dimensional form.
