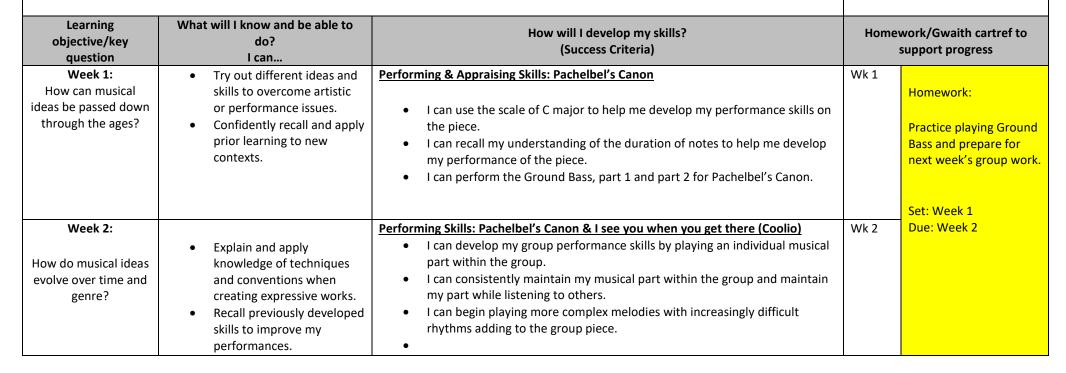
Ethical, informed citizen
