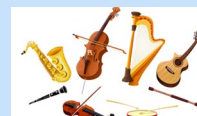




Playlist



Ssh... What's that noise? Is it a bash, a crash, a shake or a hum? This term, we'll listen to a live musical performance, picking out the different sounds and techniques. Roger McGough's poem, *The Sound Collector*, will inspire us to go on a sound walk around school. We'll investigate the volume of sounds and make vibrations using different equipment. Our toes will be tapping along to all kinds of music, and we'll be listening to song lyrics to get lots of ideas.

Language and Communication

Llythrennedd a Chyfathrebu

Pupils will read Roger McGough's poem, *The Sound Collector* and create their own piece of poetry to perform.

Short narratives and silent movies – Pupils will listen, discuss ideas, note instruments, plan a scene, refine details, time actions to music, and rehearse while adjusting as needed.

Lyrics – Read and sing new lyrics together, adjust for rhythm, record performances, then listen and join in with each other's versions.

Posters - Create a one-minute radio advert using posters, add vocal effects, practise, record, refine, and upload the final version online.

Information leaflets - Draft leaflets with clear paragraphs, add photos for appeal, and highlight key facts to make important information stand out.

Eisteddfod - Explore Eisteddfod history, take notes, share ideas, write a paragraph on its development, and role-play Lord Rhys for questioning.

Performance poetry - Everyone will learn a poem to perform.

Maths and Numeracy

Mathemateg a Rhif

Pupils will be continuing their work on decimals, looking at division, making a whole, partitioning and rounding decimals.

We will be studying money – using conversion, comparison, estimating and problem solving. Pupils will be looking at time – looking at units of time, conversion from 12 and 24 hours and analogue and digital.

We will be studying shape – looking at angles, triangles, quadrilaterals, polygons and symmetry.

Pupils will learn about position and direction – being able to describe position using coordinates and translating on a grid.

Pupils will investigate how musical instruments work and enjoy making their own.

They will share their favourite music and explore how music is used in everyday life.

As a challenge, we'll create an uplifting celebration song.

Listening to a range of different musical genres to explore a variety of types of music.

Practise maths with real world contexts that can be applied out of school such as time and money.

Learn about a range of musical instruments and musical vocabulary so the pupils have a wider knowledge of how to describe music.
